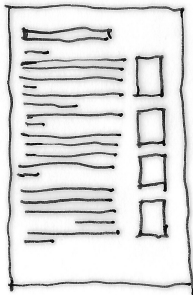


Underground London - Timeline Activity

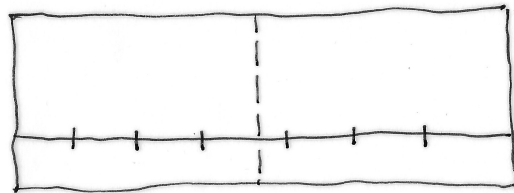
This is an activity for a pair, possibly 3 children and focuses on the main dates in the development of underground London. Sometimes a pair of children complete the first set of dates, a second pair completes the next set and the timeline is then joined to form one.

You will need either a long piece of paper or card, or tape several pieces together, plus scissors, glue and coloured pencils.

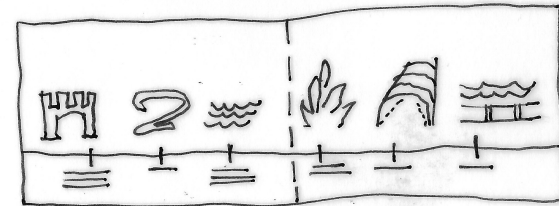

How to construct your timeline

Print out the Timeline of Underground London (black and white or colour).

There are some illustrations and photographs on the Timeline of London sheet which can be cut out and stuck on the timeline or it's even better if children draw their own illustrations.

To start off the timeline draw a straight line parallel to the bottom of your sheet, about 7-10cm from the paper's edge depending on the sheet size. (See Fig.2) Next make a perpendicular mark on this line where each date will go. Allow roughly the same amount of space for each date.

The children should add as much information for each date as possible. They can research the topics they find most interesting and fill the sheet. It is possible to work on individual sheets and then join them all together if necessary. Make sure to keep the dates in the right order!
